Spring because I get to see the baby lambs and chicks.

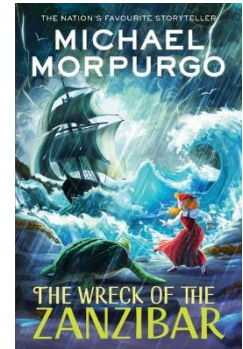
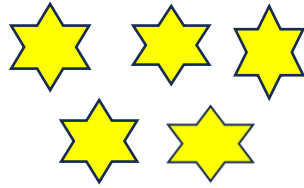

The Wreck of the Zanzibar by Michael Morpurgo

The wreck of the Zanzibar is an amazing book by Michael Morpurgo, the author of war horse. It is all about a girl called Laura who lives on an island in the Isles of Scilly. The island is called Bryher. The island is starving. The family's cows are dying, the weather is destroying houses and boats and Laura's twin brother, Billy, runs away to join a ship's crew. How to make cupcakes with an adult.



Ingredients

110g softened butter
110g golden caster sugar
2 large eggs
 $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp vanilla extract
110g self-raising flour

For the buttercream

150g softened butter
300g icing sugar
1 tsp vanilla extract
3 tbsp milk

1. Heat the oven to 160 degrees
2. Beat together the butter, sugar and eggs.
3. Add half a table spoon of vanilla extract, 110g of self-raising flour and mix together.
4. Divide the mixture between your cupcake cases and bake for 15 minutes until golden brown.
5. Leave to cool on a wire rack.
6. To make the buttercream, whisk the butter and icing sugar until soft and then add the vanilla extract. Beat in 3 tbsp of milk. Add food colouring if you want to!
7. Once the cakes are cool you can spoon or pipe the icing onto the cupcake.
